

This year's CAPA Board of Directors includes five new members, Larry Wang (CAPA president as ex officio), Guoli Chen, Hongbo Yu, Tong Sun, Qiuying Shi, and four members from previous year Gang Wang, Xiaoying Liu, Helen Zhang, and Wei Zhang. The BOD held five meetings on 4/1/2023, 8/6/2023, 11/12/2023, 12/1/2024 and 3/2/2024. BOD members have collaboratively engaged in various projects including committee approvals, international collaborations, award selections, and other CAPA initiatives, functioning effectively as a cohesive group.

The following is a summary of major achievements of the 2024-2025 BOD:

1.CAPA Bylaws was amended - The Amendment 1 to "Article VII" has been reviewed, approved, and adopted by the 2024-2025 CAPA members on January 10, 2025 (see Bylaws). Amendment 1 to Article VII of CAPA bylaws (Approved on 1/10/2025)

Purpose:

To revise the timing of the election for the President-Elect of CAPA.

Timeline:

The election of the President-Elect by the Board of Directors (BOD) shall occur concurrently with the election of BOD and/or the President when occurred by eligible members, as applicable.

Responsibilities of the President-Elect:

The President-Elect shall be a regular member of the Executive Committee (EC) and perform all duties associated with that role. The President-Elect will work closely with the President to assist in fulfilling the President's responsibilities under the leadership of the President of CAPA.

Initial Election (2026 election):

When this amendment takes effect, both the President and President-elect positions will be elected simultaneously, and the roles will be filled accordingly.

Subsequent Elections (starting in the 2027 election):

In subsequent years, only the position of the President-elect shall be vacant, as the President-elect from the previous year shall assume the position of the President. The election shall then be held only for the President-elect.

2. Joint BOD transition meeting:

Invited new BOD members (4 new BOD members and the president-elect) to participate in the final BOD meeting of 2025, enabling them to become acquainted with the board's responsibilities and rules. This early exposure is intended to enhance their future effectiveness.

3. International collaborations:

The BOD approved the collaboration with the Germany Society of Pathology; a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was also approved.

4. National collaborations:

BOD approval on organizing scientific symposiums at the 2025 USCAP Annual Business Meeting. BOD approval on hosting a companion meeting at the 2025 USCAP Annual Meeting. The BOD approved the proposal on proceeding the collaboration between CAPA and CAP for the 11th CAPA Diagnostic Course in 2025 BOD approval on planning a companion meeting with the College of American Pathologists in Florida (2025)

5. Industry sponsors collaboration:

The BOD approved collaborations with several industry sponsors for our annual diagnostic course and business meeting

- 6. CAPA Election: CAPA election was successfully held in January 2025, resulting in the election of a President- Elect. Four new board members were elected by CAPA members.
- 7. Recipient of the Distinguished Pathologist Award was selected.
- 8. CAPA Business Meeting in Boston: Budget for the upcoming 2025 CAPA Business Meeting is approved by BOD.

CAPA Educational Committee Report (2024-2025)

We thank all the Education Committee chair/co-chairs, subcommittee chairs/co-chairs/members/advisors, and volunteers for their tremendous support during the year of 2024-2025!

1. The 10th CAPA Annual Diagnostic Course, 10/19/2024 – 10/20/2024 in Las Vegas The Education Committee successfully organized the 10th Diagnostic Course, which marked the second year of in-person meetings after the COVID pandemic.

The course featured two keynote speakers and 23 faculty members from 12 subspecialties, who delivered outstanding presentations to an audience of 118 attendees in Downtown Las Vegas. The course had a joint sponsorship with the College of American Pathologists (CAP), which enabled us to provide Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits to our attendees. A total of 71 attendees claimed 623 CMEs from the diagnostic course. The meeting was also a financial success, thanks to the generous support of the sponsors, with a surplus of over \$5,000 after the meeting. We would like to extend special thanks to Dr. Yiting Li for her major contribution to the meeting logistics and local support, and to Dr. Wei Zhang for her efforts in connecting with onsite sponsors to secure funding support for this educational activity.

Dear CAPA Members,

From March 2024 to March 2025, the CAPA Online Education (OLE) Program has continued its mission of delivering high-quality educational opportunities to our members. We are proud to report substantial accomplishments over the past year, including robust participation in our lecture series and key improvements in program efficiency and sustainability.

Major Educational Activities:

• Weekly Online Education ProgramWe hosted a total of 36 webinars, including 30 CME-accredited lectures and 6 non-CME lectures, attracting an average of over 260 attendees per session, with a cumulative attendance of approximately 8,000 participants.

- **CME Claiming:** For each CME-accredited lecture, **50 to 120 CME credits** were claimed, reflecting strong engagement from the pathology community.
- Collaborative Sessions: We supported 8 webinars organized by the Leadership and Career
 Development Committee. In collaboration with other CAPA subcommittees, we supported 4 educational sessions and 3 training-focused lectures.
- Operational ImprovementsIn 2024, we transitioned our CME accreditation process from CAP Joint Providership to RussoCME, yielding a cost savings of over \$2,000 in CME application fees, which contributes to the long-term sustainability of our program.

CAPA's financial status has been stable over the past year. 
