In my previous message, I outlined several key initiatives. I am now delighted to share with you the progress and accomplishments we have made since March.




#### 1. Innovation in Education and Professional Development

#### 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Diagnostic Course/CAPA-CAP companion meeting

The Executive Committee has approved the proposal from the Meeting Organizing committee and Logistics Support Subcommittee. The highly anticipated course will be held at the **Orlando World Center Marriott Hotel**, in conjunction with the CAP25 Annual Meeting, on September 12, 2025. This event will be especially meaningful, as Dr. Jim Zhai will be inaugurated as President of CAP during the meeting—a proud and historic moment for CAPA. The course will feature a diverse array of educational sessions encompassing Anatomic Pathology (AP), Clinical Pathology (CP), Molecular Pathology (MP), and Digital Pathology (DP).

## 2) Launch of CAPA Digital Platform in Collaboration with PathPresenter

### Upcoming Digital Pathology Survey

Under the leadership of Dr. Wei Chen, we will soon launch a digital pathology survey among our members. This initiative aims to explore the current landscape and applications of digital pathology, whole slide imaging (WSI), and artificial intelligence (AI) in our field. The insights gathered will help ensure that CAPA members stay at the forefront of technological and diagnostic advancements in pathology.

**2. Fostering Collaboration and Global Engagement** – CAPA has always thrived on collaboration, and we continue to expand our global partnerships to foster knowledge exchange and professional growth.

#### 1) CAPA-CAP companion meeting

The CAPA–CAP Companion Meeting will be held on Saturday, September 13, 2025, from 2:00–4:00 PM ET. Registration is available through [CAP.org](https://CAP.org). This session will feature four expert presentations on rapidly evolving areas in pathology, including diagnostic criteria, biomarkers, novel therapies, and AI-powered tools.

#### 2) The 5th CAPA–ASC Companion Meeting

The 5th CAPA–ASC Companion Meeting, titled *“Recent Advances in Precision Cytopathology”*, has been approved by both the American Society of Cytopathology and CAPA. It will take place during the ASC 73rd Annual Scientific Meeting in St. Louis, Missouri, from November 5–9, 2025. Organized by Drs. Xiaoying Liu, Fang Fan, Tieying Hou, Xiaohua Qian, and Jun Wang, this session highlights CAPA’s expanding impact and will focus on the latest advancements in precision cytopathology.

#### 3) German Society of Pathology (DGP)

As part of our continued educational collaboration with DGP, several CAPA members—Dr. Liang Cheng (online), Dr. Chen Liu, Dr. Jinsong Liu, Dr. Huamin Wang, Dr. Jun Wang, Dr. Jing Zhang, and Dr. Larry Wang—have been invited to speak at the 108th Annual Meeting of the DGP, taking place June 12–14, 2025, in Leipzig, Germany. This event serves as a counterpart to CAPA’s Annual Meeting in Boston this past March, where DGP representatives were warmly welcomed. DGP will now host a CAPA delegation, continuing the transatlantic scientific exchange and deepening our partnership.



#### 4) AP-IAP companion meeting

Further strengthening our collaboration with AP-IAP, several CAPA members—Drs. Larry Wang, Chen Liu, Shaoxiong Chen, Zhaohai Yang, Ximing Yang, Bo Xu, Yun Wu, Hooding Xu, and Guoping Cai—have been invited to present at AP-IAP 2025, scheduled to take place in Bangkok, Thailand, in November 2025.

#### 5) CAPA-IAC collaboration

We have initiated productive discussions with the leadership of the International Academy of Cytology (IAC), including current President Dr. Syed Ali and immediate past President Dr. Fernando Schmitt. We are pleased to report that the IAC Board of Directors has approved CAPA's inclusion as an affiliated society, marking another milestone in CAPA's international engagement.

#### 6) CAPA-DPA collaboration

CAPA remains an allied society of the Digital Pathology Association (DPA), a partnership that continues to provide financial support to CAPA and complimentary DPA memberships to our members. We value this ongoing collaboration and its contributions to advancing digital pathology education and outreach.

## International Symposium on the Future of Pathology Successfully Held in Hangzhou, China


