

1. Education and Professional Development


- 1) We are pleased to share that the **11th Annual CAPA Diagnostic Course and CAPA-CAP Companion Meeting** were both resounding successes.

The **11th CAPA Diagnostic Course**, held on September 12, 2025, in Orlando, FL, brought together an extraordinary lineup of **36 distinguished speakers** who delivered state-of-the-art updates spanning anatomic pathology, clinical pathology, and the rapidly evolving field of artificial intelligence in pathology.

With a program that balanced scientific rigor and practical insights, the course provided attendees with a valuable opportunity to expand their knowledge, explore innovations, and engage in meaningful discussions with leaders in the field. The enthusiastic participation and lively exchanges throughout the day reflected the strength and vitality of our CAPA community.

The day concluded with a collegial dinner and networking reception, fostering new collaborations and strengthening professional connections. This year's course was a true milestone for CAPA, underscoring the depth of expertise within our membership and our shared commitment to advancing pathology education, collaboration, and innovation.

In addition to the course, CAPA hosted a **Companion Meeting** on September 13, 2025, during CAP25. Four world-renowned

2. Fostering Collaboration and Global Engagement – CAPA has always thrived on collaboration, and we continue to expand our global partnerships to foster knowledge exchange and professional growth.

1) The 5th CAPA-ASC Companion Meeting

The 5th CAPA-ASC Companion Meeting, titled “Recent Advances in Precision Cytopathology,” has been approved by both the American Society of Cytopathology and CAPA. It will take place during the ASC 73rd Annual Scientific Meeting in St. Louis, Missouri, from November 5–9, 2025. Organized by Drs. Xiaoying Liu, Fang Fan, Tieying Hou, Xiaohua Qian, and Jun Wang, this session highlights CAPA’s expanding impact and will focus on the latest advancements in precision cytopathology.

2) The 4th CAPA-USCAP companion meeting

Under Dr. Deyin Xin’s leadership, the 4th CAPA-USCAP Companion Meeting proposal has been approved by USCAP, and the event will be held on Sunday, March 22, 2026, from 8:00AM – 10:00AM at Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center in San Antonio, TX. This session will feature four expert presentations on rapidly evolving areas in Gynecologic and Genitourinary Pathology, and the speakers are Dr. Natalia Buza from Yale University, Dr. Wenxin Zheng from UT Southwestern, Dr. Maria Tretiakova from University of Washington and Dr. Ming Zhou from Mount Sinai.

3) German Society of Pathology (DGP)

As part of our continued educational collaboration with DGP, several CAPA members—Drs. Yang spoke at the 108th Annual Meeting of the DGP during June 12–14, 2025, in Leipzig, Germany. This event serves as a counterpart to CAPA's Annual Meeting in Boston this past March, where DGP representatives were warmly welcomed. DGP hosted our CAPA delegation, continuing the transatlantic scientific exchange and deepening our partnership.

4) AP-IAP companion meeting

Further strengthening our collaboration with AP-IAP, several CAPA members—Drs. Larry Wang, Chen Liu, Shaoxiong Chen, Zhaohai Yang, Ximing Yang, Bo Xu, Yun Wu, Haodong Xu, and Guoping Cai—have been invited to present at AP-IAP 2025, scheduled to take place in Bangkok, Thailand, in November 2025.
