### **Marilyn M. Bui, MD, PhD**

Dr. Bui is an outstanding lifetime member of CAPA who has been actively involved in and led many CAPA activities for years. Her service includes Executive Committee (EC) (2014-2018, 2020), Education Committee (Chair 2015, 2020, Co-chair 2016), Award Committee (2017) and Career Development Committee Co-Chair (2018). She is a frequent organizer and speaker of CAPA conferences representing CAPA nationally and internationally. She has a strong track record of mentoring young pathologists and promoting CAPA due to her association with various pathology societies and collaborators. Dr. Bui's major contribution to CAPA's financial wellbeing is in soliciting financial sponsorship since 2014. She holds the highest individual fundraising record (\$61,000). Dr. Bui received the CAPA Zu-Hua Gao Outstanding Service Award in 2016.

Dr. Bui received her medical doctor degree from the Capital Institute of Medicine in Beijing, China, followed by completing her PhD in Molecular Pathology Immunology, residency in Anatomic Clinical Pathology, and fellowship in Cytopathology at the University of Florida, USA.

Dr. Bui is a patient-centered pathologist with expertise that includes bone soft tissue pathology, cytopathology, biomarker testing and digital pathology/AI. She also integrates research, education, advocacy and service to better patient care. She is the lead pathologist for multiple research grants. She has published over 181 peer-reviewed articles, 24 book chapters and 3 books. She has received 2 US patents and awards in cancer research, teaching and service, including the College of American Pathologists Distinguished Patient Care Award in 2019.

Dr. Bui values the service to professional societies as she believes it is an important mechanism to influence policies and standards to improve the quality of patient care in a broader sense. She has ample leadership experience in local, national and international pathology societies including the President of Digital Pathology Association (2019), President of Medical Staff at Moffitt Cancer Center (2018-2020), Vice President of the Florida Society of Pathologists (2019-2021), and Chair of College of American Pathologists (CAP) Publications Committee (2018-2021).

It is a great honor and privilege to be considered as the candidate for the 2021 CAPA President. Dr. Bui envisions better understanding and communication of the membership needs, enrichment of professional development, and promoting friendship and wellness within CAPA. By an initiative such as expanding CAPA's influence through education and collaborations with other national and international professional societies, CAPA members will be engaged in opportunities include CME conferences, online teaching programs, academic and private practice diagnostic support through digital pathology, leadership development, social media presence, publications, and access to wellness resources. Dr. Bui credits CAPA as an important contributing factor to her professional and personal growth. Dr. Zaibo Li received his medical degree from Beijing Medical University and his Ph.D and MBA from the University of Rochester. He completed his pathology residency, fellowship in Cytopathology and Breast/Gynecologic Pathology at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.

Dr. Li is an Associate Professor, Associate Director of the pathology residency program and digital pathology division in the Department of Pathology at The Ohio State University (OSU) Wexner Medical Center. He is board-certified in Anatomic/Clinical Pathology and Cytopathology. His practice and academic interests are breast/gynecological pathology, cytopathology, and digital pathology. He has published more than 110 scientific articles and many book chapters. He has served as a section or associate editor/editorial board for several scientific Journals. He has/had also served in multiple national society committees, including USCAP Finance Committee, USCAP Abstract Review Board, CAP Cytopathology Committee, ASC Scientific Program Committee, ASC Finance Committee, and DPA Education Committee, etc.

Dr. Li is currently a lifetime member of CAPA, and he joined in CAPA activity since he was a resident. He has/had been serving on multiple CAPA committees, including Finance Committee, Award Committee, Online Education Committee, Cytopathology Subcommittee, Breast Pathology Subcommittee, COVID-19 Committee, and Annual CAPA Diagnostic Course Organizing Committee, and also served as Co-Chair for finance Committee and other committees. Dr. Li helped apply and successfully organize CAPA Companion Meetings (2019 and 2020) during ASC annual meetings (canceled in 2020 due to COVID-19). Dr. Li helped and organized multiple CAPA Annual Diagnostic Courses and CAPA Annual meetings and lectured on various CAPA organized events. In 2020, he received the "CAPA Member of the Year Award".

Dr. Li feels CAPA is a unique society he strongly belongs to and is eager to serve all CAPA members and devote his efforts to promote CAPA further nationally and internationally. He aims to better understand members' professional needs, provide opportunities for members' career development, and encourage communication and collaboration among members. For example, given his extensive experience in digital pathology, Dr. Li will promote educational activities using whole slide imaging and provide consultations for digital pathology implementation for clinical diagnosis in both academic and private practice settings. In addition, Dr. Li will provide advice and promote ACGME activities for trainees based on his many years' experience as associate director of the pathology residency program at OSU.

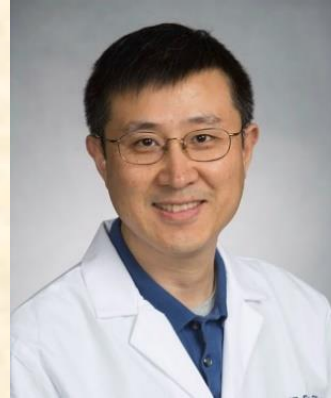

I received my medical degree from Peking University Health Science Center and PhD from The University of Michigan, and pursued my postdoctoral studies at The University of Pennsylvania. After completing AP/CP residency at The University of Toledo and Hartford Hospital, I did Hematopathology fellowship at MD Anderson Cancer Center and stayed as staff pathologist since 2013.

My clinical service and research focus on lymphoma and leukemia. I have authored 130 publications, in nearly half of them as the first or last author. Multiple studies are published in *Blood and Leukemia*. The work from our group are highlighted by journals such as *Blood and JCI*, societies such as NCCN and iCMLf, and MD Anderson Cancer Center. I serve as an Associate Editor of *Frontiers in Oncology* and also serve in the editorial boards of *American Journal of Clinical Pathology* (2018-2019), *Cancers*, *Journal of Hematology*, and *Leukemia Research*. I am a reviewer for over 30 PubMed-indexed journals.

I am fortunate to have the opportunity to supervise over 20 talented MS/PhD students, residents/fellows, and visiting scientists. The team work from our group led to a number of awards from MD Anderson, CAPA, ASH, and other national organizations. I have guided five lab members to residency. More importantly, I have helped numerous current trainees and junior attendings in different stages of their career in various ways, ranging from USMLE, to residency/fellowship application, to career planning. Most of them are and will be CAPA members.

If elected as CAPA BOD member, I will work with the President and EC as a team to promote CAPA as an organization and promote professional communications among CAPA members. I consider mentoring/promoting future/junior CAPA members as my most important involvement of CAPA activity in the past. I received my medical education at Qingdao Medical College. After studied shortly at Beijing Medical University, I continued research training at Kellogg Eye Center and received Ph.D. degree at the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. I have worked temporarily at NIH before I started my AP/CP residency training at Rutgers University-New Jersey Medical School, where I served one year of chief resident. After completing one year of hematopathology fellowship at Montefiore Medical Center/Albert Einstein School of Medicine, I started clinical practice at Hackensack Meridian Health system in 2014. Now I am a staff pathologist at Hackensack University Medical Center covering hematopathology and general surgical pathology service.

As a pathologist in a private group at community hospital, my main job is to provide clinical service. Teach and research, as a hobby, I have not given up though. I actively participate in resident teaching. I am assistant professor in the departments of Pathology and Ophthalmology at Hackensack Meridian Health School of Medicine (SOM). Each year I give lectures to students at SOM, as well as at Florence Cook School of Medical Laboratory Science. Dr. Larry Wang (王亮) is Professor of Pathology at the Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California, Associate Director of the Global Health Center and Director of Surgical Pathology at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. He is an editorial board member or invited reviewer for more than 20 international journals and serves as a council member of the International Neuroblastoma Pathology Committee and the Pathology Committee of the Child Liver Disease Research and Education Network. He is a life member of CAPA and also a House of Delegates of the American College of Pathologists. Due to his contributions to CAPA, he was awarded "CAPA Member of the Year" award for 2019-2020. As a major participant, he has received several NIH grants. He has published more than 100 scientific papers, and been invited to give lectures more than 100 times internationally. Recently, he is a contributor in the forthcoming book "Pediatric Tumors" edited by the World Health Organization.



## CAPA To Launch a Scientific Journal

The board of directors (BOD) of CAPA has approved to launch a new scientific journal of the CAPA. Dr. **Guoping Cai** at Yale University and Dr. **Huan-You Wang** at UCSD have been named as the co-editors in chief of the new scientific journal after a formal process of application and selection. The editors-in-chief will be in charge of the journal launch and other logistics. Please join the BOD to congratulate them. ### Background of the CAPA scientific journal:

As an important milestone of our development, the NIH recently recognized CAPA as a scientific society that is permitted to recommend NIH study section members. As with many other professional organizations, CAPA decided to launch our own peer-reviewed scientific journal. The journal will be focused on recent developments in diagnostic and experimental pathology.

### Requirements for editor-in-chief:

1. Track record of serving as editor-in-chief or associate editor in peer reviewed journals.
2. The rank of full professor or equivalent at a North American institution.
3. Strong track record of professional/scientific publications.
4. Proven leadership in a leading professional organization such as CAPA, USCAP, CAP, state/provincial Pathology Society, etc. or in the Department, School, or University.
5. Proven record of enthusiasm and dedication to serve the CAPA community, and a lifetime or active member of the CAPA at the time of application and during the tenure of the editorship.
6. Willingness and determination to take the responsibility and lead the efforts of starting a new journal from scratch.
7. This is an unpaid volunteer position.



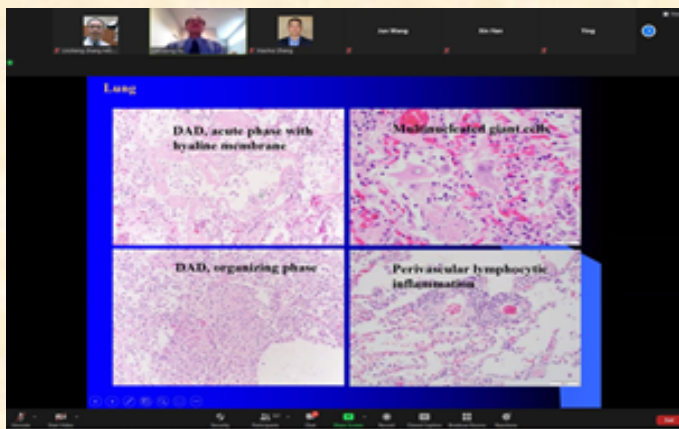
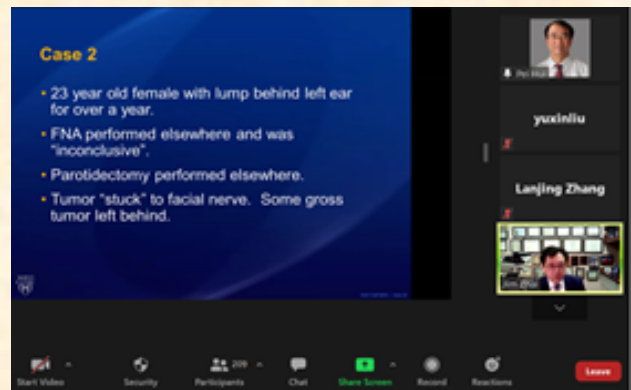
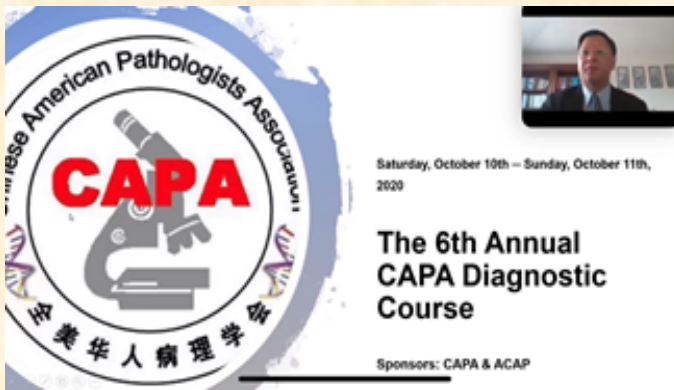
# The Sixth CAPA Diagnostic Pathology Course Held Online

- 2) All abstracts (word document format, Not PDF file) must have been accepted for presentation at the USCAP 2021 annual meeting and a copy of the USCAP acceptance letter must be submitted along with the abstract.
- 3) Please do not submit any studies that have already been published, accepted for publication, or accepted for presentation in other meetings before the date of submission.
- 4) Submission and Deadline: Please use the submission template at the bottom of this announcement to submit your abstracts to the chair of CAPA Award Committee Dr. Shaoxiong Chen at [shaoxiongchen@yahoo.com](mailto:shaoxiongchen@yahoo.com) before December 11st, 2020.
- 5) **Notification:** The abstracts will be reviewed by the CAPA Abstract Review Committee (see below) blinded to the information of authors and institutions. **The decisions will be sent out on or before January 15th, 2021.**

## The 2021 Lizhen Gui Award

Dr Lizhen Gui has generously supported the mission of the Chinese American Pathologists Association (CAPA) by establishing an award for CAPA trainee members. On behalf of the CAPA Award Committee, we are delighted to announce that **Guofeng Gao, MD, PhD** was unanimously selected as the winner of 2021 Lizhen Gui Award.

This year, we have received application materials from 6 excellent candidates from the CAPA community. The evaluation is based on clinical performance, research/publications during his or her pathology training, leadership and service to CAPA and other pathology organizations. Award committee members independently reviewed application documents of each candidate.

Dr. Gao graduated from BinZhou Medical College (Shangdong) and later pursued his graduate study in Genetics at The Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine. He completed his AP/CP training at UC Davis. Currently, he is a genitourinary pathology fellow at Johns Hopkins, Maryland. In July 2021, he will pursue breast pathology fellowship training at Stanford University, California.

Since he started his residency training in 2016, he has published 9 articles in peer-review journals and presented 9 abstracts in national/international meetings. He obtained multiple national Scholarship/Grants, such as 2020 ASCP-USCAP Excel-erate Scholarship, ASCP 2018 Resident Subspecialty (Genitourinary pathology) Grant, and ASCP/USCAP 2018 combined Just Say Know! Resident Trainee Leadership Training Scholarship, and ASCP 2018 Foundation Travel Grant. Particularly, his research demonstrates that glomerular fibrin thrombi undergo rapid resolution following transplantation and such recipients have experienced good clinical outcomes. His findings lowered discarded rates of deceased donor kidneys and was published at the journal *Transplantation* with him as the first author. This research project also won Pathologist in Training Best Abstract Award at USCAP 2018 Annual Meeting (Renal Pathology Society).
