This year, we received a total of 23 abstracts from 19 applicants for this competition. These winners were selected after a careful reviewing of all eligible abstracts by 10 reviewers. The quality of these research is amazing. To get a fair evaluation, author names and institution names have been removed. Based on the abstract quality (such as novel idea, new method/technology, significant findings, etc), each committee member reviewed all abstracts independently. One score ranging from 1 to 5 was given to each abstract. 5 is the highest score while 1 is the worst. The average score was calculated. This year, the competition is very tight, and the winning score ranges is 3.61 to 3.35 with a difference of 0.26 between the first place and third place.
