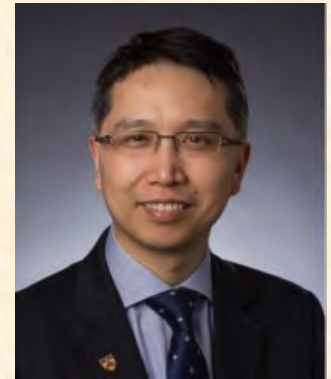

CAPA members enjoy access to information about digital pathology and artificial intelligence. In the upcoming months, CAPA will charge a bylaws committee in response to the members wishes to update the current bylaws.

In addition, we will be looking at whether some exciting pilot projects should be expanded:

1. A pilot project led by Dr. Xiuli Liu uses a peer-to-peer support model to members discover their inner strengths, develop leadership skills, promote wellness and cultivate long-lasting friendships through personal interactions. Could this be the cradle of a new leadership academy that will build a pipeline for future leaders of CAPA or pathology community? Could this be the beginning of a CAPA wellness institute that makes for happier pathologists and people. I hope so!
2. A pilot project led by Dr. Shi Wei -- the Curbside Consult of Bone and Soft Tissue Pathology -- discusses challenging, rare, or interesting cases via a Zoom meeting using an interfaced digital camera. In addition to providing education, this activity fosters collaboration and friendship among CAPA members. Perhaps this initiative will serve as a template for other interactive distance learning opportunities in pathology subspecialties.
3. A CAPA group is working to connect CAPA members with the College of American Pathologists (CAP). The CAP interest group on WeChat is led by Dr. Jim Zhai. Our members are informed by peers about the CAP House of Delegates, various committees, lab inspections, practice guidelines, and many more educational and professional development opportunities.

The CAPA 2021 Annual Meeting on March 13 marks the transition of the CAPA leadership team. Words cannot express my respect and gratitude to Dr. Lanjing Zhang and the 2020-2021 leadership team. We have been well served! Please also join me in welcoming CAPA 2021-2022 Board of Directors: Drs. - Edited a special section on the *Arch Pathol Lab Med* (accepted 6 of the 10 articles).
- Became recognized by the NIH as a scientific society that is eligible to recommend reviewers.
- Collected input on the current bylaws from CAPA members.
- Hosted 2 townhall meetings, the sixth annual diagnostic course, the companion meeting to ASC and several career development sessions.
- Co-hosted the sixth CAPA-CHCAMS cancer diagnostic pathology summit.
- Two well-organized and well-received performances by the Duotou Performing Arts Ensemble.
- Established the CAPA Young Investigator Award to encourage scientific research.
- Strengthened our financial position.
- Increased CAPA member number.
- Developed the online forum for case presentations and discussions.
- Initiated case presentation series for associate members,
- Maintained weekly online education program.
- Publishing 4 issues of the newsletters and meeting brochure.
- Formed liaisons with other pathology societies.
- Evaluated and gave the inaugural Lizhen Gui award, and CAPA-GoPath abstract awards.

- Established a multitask COVID-19 fund to combat COVID-19 in our community including purchasing masks, funding COVID-19 related research projects from pathologists and funding COVID-19 related community projects from high school/college students.
- We have raised more than 50K\$ (54,051\$) which were donated from more than 300 individual CAPA members and also received a total of about \$33,500 in-kind or cash donations from 5 organizations, including Shenzhen Horb Tech Ltd, Sias University, Champions of Medical Advancement Associates, Chinese Community of Madison CT and UNMC Alumni Association of Chinese Visiting Scholars and Students.
- A CAPA member online town hall meeting was successfully held to discuss how to appropriate utilize the donation to help CAPA community to combat COVID-19 disease.
- We have purchased and sent 500 to 3000 masks to each of the 19 hospitals in various sizes and locations.
- CAPA Research Award: The CAPA Research Committee awarded two pathologists, Dr. Limin Yu from Oakland University and Dr. Kun Hu from University at Buffalo for their research works on COVID-19 (*Am J Trans Res 2020*).
- CAPA COVID-19 Relief Award: The awards (up to \$1,500 each) will enable the high school and college students to effectively and timely relieve the burdens of COVID-19. The review committee included representatives of the CAPA members, donors (non-CAPA member) and COVID-19 committee members have awarded 9 high school/college students for various prizes (First prize: 1; second prize: 2; third prize: 6).
- ~\$5000 leftover funds for COVID-19. We will let the next BOD decide how to best use it aligned with the donation causes.

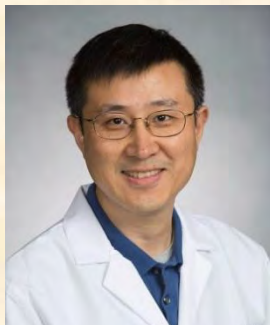

About the award: Donated by Dr Lanjing Zhang and his wife (\$500 each year for 10 years, and renewable), and approved by the Financial team, Executive Committee and BOD. The formal criteria will be developed by the award committee and Dr Lanjing Zhang or his designee. The following 3 tentative election-criteria should be met by the candidate for this year; one award per year or not given (money forwarded to the next year) if no suitable candidate:

- A. Significant or continuous contribution to the CAPA, in addition to a lifetime or active membership of the CAPA for 3 consecutive years;
- B. Within 10 years of post-fellowship/residency training whichever is later (e.g., graduated in or after June 2010 for the 2020 fall cycle [presented on the 2021 annual meeting]);
- C. Had one of the following three scientific contribution metrics: 1. Holding or held an extramural research grant/award as a PI/mentor (e.g., for trainee grants such as T32, K08); 2. Thirty (30) first- or senior-authored peer-reviewed original research articles that are indexed in Pubmed.gov; 3. Five (5) high-impact first- or senior-authored original articles, each with >50 citations or 5 original articles in a journal with 2-year SCI/Web of science impact factor > 10 (the two sub-criteria can be mixed and combined).

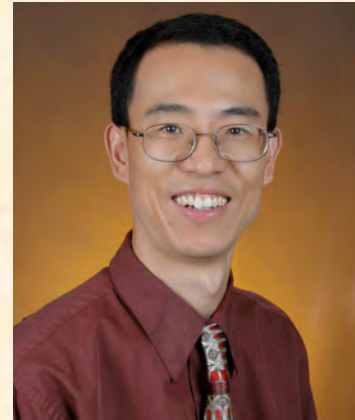

Dr. Huan-you Wang is a Professor of Pathology from the Divisions of Laboratory and Genomic Medicine, Department of Pathology, University of California San Diego. He also serves as Director of Hematopathology Fellowship, Medical Director of Clinical Hematology Laboratory and Co-Director of Hematology. He has published more than 100 peer-reviewed articles with total of 2442 citations. He has written seven chapters for six books. In addition, he serves as editorial board members in several professional journals.

Dr. Wang is a life member of the Chinese American Pathologists Association (CAPA) and he has been a member of Executive Committee (EC) since March 2020.

Dr. Wang's involvement in CAPA could be traced back to 2014, but his intimate engagement with CAPA started in 2015, when he served as member of EC until 2019 and again from 2020-2021. During this period, he also served as Chair of Newsletter Committee from 2017-2018, Chair of Education Committee from 2018-2019, and Chair of Hematopathology Sub-committee since 2016. His involvement of CAPA climaxed in 2019 when he was elected as the President of CAPA. During his tenure as president, together with all members of BOD and EC, he oversaw a stable and smooth transition for this organization and seamless adoption as well as application of the Bylaw; materialization of 501c(3) by IRA. During his tenure, together with other societies and institutions, he had organized or co-organized record number of professional meeting in the US or abroad, especially during the 11th Asia-Pacific Division of International Academy of Pathology, CAPA was a vital force and there were total of 17 speakers from CAPA who delivered well-received talks. There were 30 online lectures with average 270 attendees per session. Our membership increased during 2019-2020 with 302 lifetime members in addition to regular and associate members. Despite increased expenses incurred due to record number of meetings and negative impact of COVID-19, our financial wellbeing was stronger than ever before.

Dr. Wang would like to thank all members of CAPA for your support and active participations. He would like to thank all members of BOD (Drs. Bill Li, Feng Li, Xiuli Liu, Zenggang Pan, Huihong Xu, He Wang, Haodong Xu, and Jiehao Zhou) and EC (Drs. Dr. Xin Han received his medical degree from Wenzhou Medical University and his M.S. in Pathophysiology at Shanghai JiaoTong University (former Shanghai Second Medical University). Dr. Han was a hematologist in China before he joined Barnes-Jewish Hospital, Washington University in St Louis as a research associate. After completing a combined AP-CP residency training at Temple University Hospital in 2004, he finished his hematopathology fellowship training at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center, where he stayed as an Assistant Professor. Dr. Han has been a Medical Director for Section of Point-of-Care Testing and Section of Reference Laboratory/Specimen Processing and have been serving as Chair of Institutional Point-of-Care Testing Committee for more than ten years. Currently, he is a Professor of Pathology at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center.

Dr. Han joined in CAPA activity as early as 2004 when he was a fellow. Since then, he has actively involved in many CAPA activities. In 2016, he became a member of CAPA Membership Committee. He has been serving as Co-Chair of CAPA Membership Committee since March 2018. Dr. Han played an important role in establishing our new CAPA membership registration system and account maintenance. He verified each membership applicant's practicing/training status and approved or declined the application appropriately. In addition, during CAPA voting events, he played a major role in validating each voter's eligibility. Dr. Han also has been building up and updating CAPA member's email database constantly. He also assist in CAPA major events such as 2018 New York and 2019 Los Angeles CAPA Annual Diagnostic Courses, 2019 CAPA Annual meeting including dinner registration and reception. He received his residency training in pathology at UT McGovern Medical School from 1999 to 2003 and his fellowship in Selective Surgical Pathology at UT MD Anderson Cancer Center (MDACC) from 2003 to 2004. Dr. Wang joined the Department of Pathology at MDACC in 2004 as an Assistant Professor specialized in gastrointestinal, liver and pancreatic pathology. He was promoted to an Associate Professor in 2009 through an accelerated track and to a professor in 2015. Dr. Wang is currently a professor of pathology with tenure and joint appointments as a professor in the Department of Translational Molecular Pathology, MDACC and at MD Anderson UTHealth Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences.

Dr. Wang was the President of the Chinese American Pathologists Association (CAPA) from 2016 to 2017.

Dr. Wang is a well-recognized GI Pathologist both nationally and internationally and a physician scientist in translational research on pancreatic cancer. He has served as principle investigator (PI), pathology core leaders, co-PI, or co-investigator for more than 40 ongoing or completed research grants. His laboratory research, currently funded by two NIH/NCI R01 grants, has been focused on many aspects of pancreatic cancer, including protein kinase and phosphatase alterations, novel pathophysiologic mechanisms and development of new biomarkers. 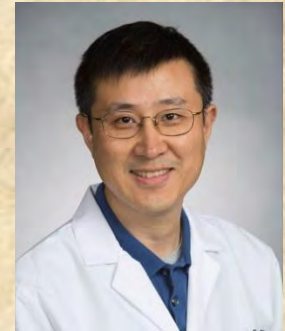

Report on the COVID-19 Relief Award

Countless medical professionals and other healthcare providers have made great sacrifices to fight the spread of COVID-19 across the globe, and it is our duty as the people who benefit from their sacrifice, to ensure that their families receive all the care they require. This project would send the children of medical professionals who have suffered from this pandemic a book once a month that has been curated by the Teen Advisory Group of RJ Julia, one of the nation's foremost independent booksellers. This group is comprised of three different bodies, two of which are comprised of teenagers (including myself) and one which is comprised of younger children. Once this book has been read, the Teen Advisory Group will get into contact with these children and a TAG group that is similar in age to the participant will discuss the month's book with them. This project's duration can be scaled, determined by the amount of funding provided.

We aimed and achieved in the project:

1. To provide the children of medical professionals with books in order to provide a method of escape and allow them to process their mental state.
2. To provide a supportive group for children of medical professionals who have been impacted by the pandemic.

In our plan, the RJ Julia's Teen Advisory Group (TAG), will contact with the chosen participants of this plan. A first preparatory meeting will be held with the members of TAG and other participants to determine their interests in books, and then a first novel will be selected and set to each of the participants. After the participants have read their books, TAG will get in contact with them again and discuss both the book and any other matters the participants wish to talk about. These book selection and meetings will occur monthly as long as funding allows.

We have no luck in securing interested groups during the first 4 months. But, in August 2020, after contacting a representative of United Way of Greater New Haven, a connection was finally established. I began implementing my project. We have successfully designated a group of employees whose children will be the recipients of this project, and are prepared to begin sending out books as soon as shipping addresses are received.

As of Dec 28, we have officially sent out sign-up information to the staff of Yale New Haven Hospital, and were now waiting for all of our slots to fill. After that, we began sending out books to our participants, which should occur within a week or two. We have decided to hold four meeting with 6 weeks between each to allow for shipping and to give the participants time to read each book. Each meeting will have anywhere between 20-30 participants, depending on what our budget allows, and will be run by RJ Julia's TAG, as mentioned in my initial proposal. We very much thank the CAPA for making this entire endeavor possible.

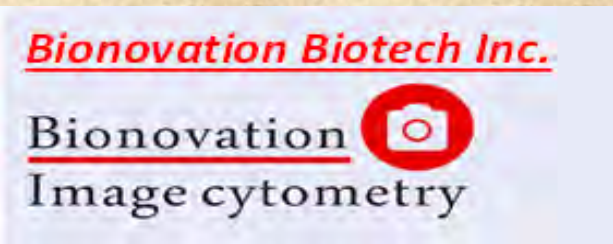
