Education committee and subcommittees

To enhance CAPA education activities, CAPA education committee under the leadership of Dr. Shaoxiong Chen with the guidance of Dr. Marilyn Bui, has established 19 education subcommittees based on pathology subspecialties, with the approval from CAPA EC and BOD. Eight new subcommittees (immunohistochemistry, molecular pathology, pathology informatics/digital pathology, neuropathology, autopsy, thoracic pathology, clinical pathology and pediatric pathology) are added. Detailed information is available on the CAPA website. Chairs and members of each subcommittee are involved in organizing CAPA weekly online education lecture, CAPA annual diagnostic course, and more. Each subcommittee is also encouraged to organize its own presentation, case discussion, consultation, etc. Weekly bone and soft tissue curbside consultation led by Dr. Shi Wei has been successful. Preparation of 2021 CAPA diagnostic course is undergoing well. This effort is led by Drs. He Wang and Linsheng Zhang as well the organizing committee. Our keynote speaker, Dr. Jason Hornick from Brigham and Women's Hospital/Harvard University will update us on the most useful "next-generation" diagnostic markers, which are significantly changing clinical practice for surgical pathologists. Forty CAPA speakers will give presentations to update us on the recent development in pathology on Sept 11 and Sept 12. The link to detailed information of this meeting will be available soon. We are grateful that various education activities are underway by a group of dedicated CAPA members working together to benefit the CAPA community.

THE 7th ANNUAL CAPA DIAGNOSTIC COURSE

The 7th annual CAPA diagnostic course will be held between September 11-12, 2021. Due to the COVD-19 pandemic, we moved the traditional CAPA diagnostic course on-line again this year. This 2-day course provides in-depth coverage on all topics including recent advance in pathology informatics, molecular pathology, immunohistochemistry, and practical topics including those commonly encountered in daily diagnostic pathology in a format of didactic lectures and case-based presentations.

Our keynote speaker of this year, Dr. Jason Hornick from Brigham and Women's Hospital/Harvard University, will update us on the most useful "next-generation" diagnostic markers, which are significantly changing clinical practice for surgical pathologists, separated into three general categories: (1) protein correlates of molecular genetic alterations, (2) protein products of gene rearrangements, and (3) markers identified by gene expression profiling. There will 47 lectures of different topics in the 2-day course which will be presented by national experts from CAPA across all subspecialties of diagnostic pathology. The course will address the questions and challenges and provide the updates and expert experiences in diagnostic pathology that practicing pathologists encounter in day-to-day practice, help the practicing pathologists to avoid the commonly encountered diagnostic errors and become proficient in different subspecialties, and help residents and fellows with their subspecialty board exam preparations. 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Available subcommittee reports

Online Education Subcommittee

Mission: The Online Education (OLE) Subcommittee leverages virtual educational platform via Zoom webinars to provide the CAPA members a regular educational program. The program also offers teaching opportunities for pathologists who have strong interests in education, promote professional communication, friendship and collaboration among all CAPA members to enhance the excellence of pathology practice.

Proposed activities:

In 2021-2022, the OLE Subcommittee will continue to run the Education Webinars on practical topics of molecular genetic pathology and surgical pathology. The topics will cover molecular genetic pathology, cytopathology, breast, soft tissue, genitourinary, gastrointestinal, hepatic and pancreatic, pulmonary, head and neck pathology. In addition to the regular lectures, we will try to schedule special lectures to cover more in-depth and advanced topics. (Please see announcement and currently scheduled presentations on page 19 and 20). The OLE Subcommittee will also provide technical support to the webinar conferences hosted by the Peer Support Program and Autopsy Subcommittee.

Autopsy education subcommittee

Mission: Autopsy plays a pivotal role for the integration of medical knowledge and as a barometer of the patient safety initiative. The autopsy aids in the education of residents and fellows by providing teaching materials for clinical and pathological correlations. Additionally, the autopsy provides an opportunity for pathology residents and fellows to augment their knowledge of normal and abnormal anatomy and histology.

The role of Autopsy Committee is to teach residents and fellows anatomic and clinical pathology through interesting autopsy cases and to foster the communications among pathologists to improve autopsy services.

Proposed activities:

- 1. Lectures. We are planning to give online lectures 4 times a year at least.
- 2. Autopsy committee members will have quarterly meetings to discuss how to improve our mission.
- 3. Organizing interesting case presentations and encouraging residents to present autopsy cases.
- 4. To help residents and fellows to do researchers on autopsy cases

Immunohistochemistry subcommittee

Mission: Immunohistochemistry (IHC) subcommittee will provide expertise to promote education and facilitate member communication for advancement of knowledge about IHC application in clinical practice.

IHC is one of the most important tools for anatomic pathology practice and is intimately integrated with all subspecialties. Many topics in IHC (such as proficiency testing, and etc) are the focus for College of American Pathologists (CAP). The CAP IHC committee provides scientific expertise to CAP regarding the practice of immunohistochemistry; monitor new and emerging issues/practices/technologies in IHC that may impact CAP members; provide input to CAP regarding legislative and economic issues related to the practice of anatomic pathology; contribute to continuing education of CAP members and etc. The IHC subcommittee in CAPA will serve

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as a bridge between CAPA and CAP IHC committee and share insights of CAP's IHC initiatives and regulatory focuses. The IHC subcommittee in CAPA will also facilitate communications among various CAPA subspecialty groups on the specific topic and enhances IHC's unique features in clinical practice. The IHC subcommittee can also encourage and help current CAPA members who are interested in joining and serving in the CAP IHC committee.

Proposed activities:

- 1. We are planning to give online lectures 2 times a year (one focus on IHC lab related issue and one focus on clinical application).
- 2. Subcommittee members will have semi-annual meetings to discuss how to improve our mission.
- 3. To help CAPA members on IHC related issues.

Curbside Consultation-Bone and Soft Tissue Pathology Subgroup

Mission: This peer to peer group activity is to discuss challenging, rare, or interesting cases for educational purpose. The group leader and the fellow peer consultants are experienced bone and soft tissue pathologists who will provide informal consultation to whom are interested to join a zoom meeting weekly. Dr. Paul Zhang will serve as an advisor to provide ad hoc consultation and connect the consultants to additional resources and opportunities. This activity is to promote the education, support, collaboration and friendship among CAPA members.

Format: On every Tuesday 5-5:30 pm EST (tentatively for now; subject to change to accommodate most participants), each presenter (self-identified) will have a couple of minutes to show an unknown case to the group of consultants for their 2nd opinion. Please note that pertinent clinical and radiologic information and the pathology information via a digital camera without disclosing any confidential information of the patient will be presented, i.e. strictly following HIPPA rules. Although this educational activity may also be helpful in real time practice, we must emphasize that the content of the case discussion is for reference only and should not be used as a formal consultation for diagnosis. The members participating in the discussion shall not bear any legal responsibility for the pathology report and their names should not appear in the report.

Call for Action: If you are a bone and soft tissue pathology expert and wish to join the consultant group, please let Dr. Shi Wei know. If you wish to be on the weekly meeting to either show your case or just observe, please inform Dr. Wei to keep you on the group mailing/information dissemination list. We also welcome any suggestions that will make this a practical, informative and meaningful activity for all.

Mission: Discover inner strength, develop leadership skills, refine professionalism, promote wellness and cultivate long-lasting friendships through personal interactions and support from peer to peer.

Background: CAPA members are known for our dedication and industrious work ethic in pursuing excellence in diagnosis, research, and education. While the unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic may have slowed our pace in professional development, it also allowed us more time to reflect. Some of the CAPA members got together and brainstormed the idea to initiate a pilot project aimed at helping each other discover our inner strengths, developing leadership skills and refining professionalism through engagement and action, promoting wellness and happiness, and cultivating long-last friendships among CAPA members. We believe that these skills will ultimately empower CAPA members and make us not only better pathologists, but also healthier and happier people.

Mission: To continue the traditions of building a strong community network and the stellar work done by the previous private practice committee we would like to continue to serve all private practice Chinese American pathologists including CAPA member and future CAPA members. During this year, our objectives include:

- 1. To guide new or future private practice pathologists to gain the tools and resources in their beginning career;
- 2. To collaborate with experienced private pathologists update their diagnostic criteria;
- 3. To promote wellness and cultivate long-term friendship through personal interaction and support each other;
- 4. To encourage more PP pathologists to join CAPA and help each other.

Background:

There are so far about 1200-2000 Chinese American pathologists, and we account for about 5-10% of all USA pathologists. The majority of Chinese American Pathologists work in community hospitals or medical groups as private practice settings. Most recent graduates/early career pathologists are more familiar in an Academic setting since residency and fellowship training are generally in the academic programs. They may have a strong desire to get to know how to build a solid foundation for their new challenges in private practice or maybe other entrepreneurial activities down the line. For the experienced Pathologists, keeping updated on the newest diagnostic criteria will help foster a good relationship with their own clinicians as both pathology and clinical guidelines are constantly being updated. In addition, there are many midcareer academic pathologists that may also explore private practice. These pathologists may also seek help as the work forces and subspecialty coverage may be changed after switching to PP setting. In addition, many CAPA PP pathologists still have interests in clinical research and wish to publish.

Proposing activities:

- 1. Committee meeting every 3 months to discuss how to serve CAPA PP pathologists better;
- 2. Each member is the local leader to develop many local small groups through enjoying Chinese food, fostering friendship, learning updating pathology diagnostic criteria and sharing interesting cases together;
- 3. Other social events such as trip nearby or national meetups;
- 4, Collaborate in clinical research through case studies or case reports.

2021 CAPA Private Practice Committee meeting #1 notes:

The 2021 CAPA private practice committee had their first zoom meeting on May 1st. 11 out of the 12 members (Drs. Just for the scientific endeavor alone, over 30% of the Nobel Prize Laureates in the United States during 1901-2013 were born in other countries, including 6 from Greater China, 5 from Japan, and 7 from India^{1, 2}. Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are a vital and integral part of this diverse nation.

We call on you to denounce in the strongest terms all forms of discrimination and crimes against any racial/ ethnic group, including Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. We call on you to pursue racial equality and tolerance in the United States and beyond. We call on you to stand strong and together with us.


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
